


Highlights of 2016

- Worked 49 states and 79 of 83 ARRL sections




Station Locations





- Antenna locations and lengths are approximate
- Station and antenna locations were adequate for preventing mutual interference











- Deleted contacts:
 - Dupes. CW: 3.8%, Phone: 1.2%, Digital: 7.4%
 - Unrecognizable callsigns
 - PART club member QSOs
- Logging anomalies (Don't affect FD score)
 - Missing, partial, or incorrect exchange
 - Extra characters appended to callsign
 - Callsign not in QRZ.com
 - Many are correctable

Things That Worked

- Site survey 2-3 weeks prior is vital. Include station and antenna leads.
- Safety officers and safety checklist
- Battery backup Thanks, Greg (N1DAM)
- Generator logs
- Diversity reception is surprisingly effective
- 24 hour operations



Lessons Learned

- ✓ Thorough preparation is essential. Create checklists, inventory and test all equipment and software 2-3 months in advance. Allow plenty of time for checkout.
- ✓ FD success depends on Friday's antenna rigging include antenna plans and training at club meetings and site survey.
- ✓ Use dupe checker and ARRL section list for accurate logging and "clean sweep" checkoff. Get a complete exchange.
- ✓ It's a Win-Win when more people operate the stations.
